## DERBYSHIRE'S JOINT MUNICIPAL WASTE MANAGEMENT STRATEGY

Strict targets have been set to achieve this and failure to meet these targets will mean that Derbyshire County and Derby City Councils may be faced with significant fines which could have an impact on the level of council tax you pay in the future.

To comply with this legislation, over the last year the County Council, City Council and all the district and borough councils have been working together to develop a Strategy to manage household rubbish over the next 20 years.

To achieve these targets we need your full support. Every Derbyshire resident has a part to play in reducing the amount of rubbish we produce and increasing the quantity of materials we sort and recycle.
