Other Vulnerable Groups

Refugees, Asylum Seekers

Currently, few refugees or asylum seekers, migrant workers are known to live in Erewash.

The numbers of migrant workers shown from National Insurance number information in Erewash was 220 as at September 2006 – although it is important to realize that these figures may not identify the true numbers. It is not known whether these have, or will decide to reside more permanently in Erewash.

The council's Homeless and Housing support team have not knowingly had any approaches from refugees, asylum seekers or migrant workers.

Thus, at the current time, we are not assessing the housing or support needs of these groups.

However, we will continue to monitor any changes to the current situation.

Homeless families and single homeless people

Information on these groups can be found in the Erewash Homelessness Strategy 2003 – 2008 which is to be reviewed and updated during 2007/2008.

Note that homeless families and single homeless people may also be in one or more of the vulnerable groups detailed in this document – for example – have mental health problems, physical disabilities, drug or alcohol problems, fleeing domestic violence etc.
