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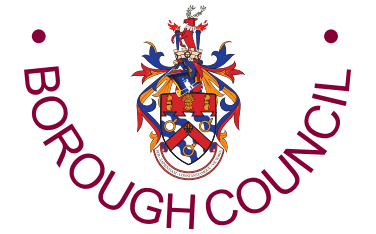
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Wasps

EREWASH



Wasps belong to the Hymenoptera (membrane winged) order of insects.

They are social insects with a highly evolved caste system in which workers (sterile females) build the nests, raise young and forage for food under the direction of the queen.

The common wasp (*Vespula vulgaris*) is mostly beneficial, destroying many insect pests to feed the growth of the nest.

Life Cycle

The queen leaves her hibernation site in the spring and seeks a suitable site to build her nest.

She constructs a golf ball size nest from wood pulp and lays a small number of eggs which she tends.

She subsequently feeds and tends the larvae.

When fully grown, the larvae pupate and sterile female workers emerge.

They then take over the task of enlarging the nest and forage for food, leaving the queen to produce more eggs.

Wasps nests may be found in almost any location (including underground) but roof spaces, wall cavities and air vents are quite common.

Towards the end of summer, fertile males and young queens emerge from the nest to mate.

The fertilised queens then seek a suitable site for winter hibernation.

The remaining males and worker wasps forage for sugary foods, including fruit, and it is during this period that they become a nuisance.

As the weather becomes colder the nest dies out and it is not re-used the following year.

Significance and Control

Nests situated away from occupied areas should not normally require any treatment.

For insects entering houses, a suitably flying insect spray with good 'knockdown' should be used.

Nests can be treated with insecticidal powders and sprays.

Great care must be exercised if attempting this, as the wasps will protect the nest.

The best time to treat a nest is at dusk when the wasps are less active.

Alternatively you could ask a professional pest control company.

Details of such firms may be found in telephone directories and similar publications.
