

Description

The church is built of rock-faced stone beneath a concrete tile roof. It is composed of a nave and chancel under one roof, north and south aisles, south transept and south porch. The transept carries a small belicote. The church contains a stained glass window by Bernard Sleigh (d.1954).



The principal building is three storeys tall and twelve bays long. The two centre bays are framed by pilasters and contain an elaborate doorcase. All windows have semi-circular heads. Francis Sudbury JP and his son Charles Sudbury JP were both mayors of likeston. George Maltby JP, a relation by marriage, rented part of the factory for lace manufacture at the turn of the century.

This building is considered to be of special historic interest due to its inclusion in a key gazetteer of industrial archaeology.
