Description
<p>A church, built in 1899. Designed by Percy Heylyn Currey in the Early English style. It is built of red brick beneath a plain tile roof. The east end features three tall lancet windows beneath a relieving arch. There are two stained glass windows (1917) by Archibald Davies. The church appears in Pevsner's Buildings of England.</p> <p>This building is considered to possess special architectural interest due to its inclusion in a key architectural gazetteer.</p>

Description
<p>A memorial cross to the First World War. The memorial takes the form of a gabled timber cross on a stone plinth, set upon a stepped stone base. The cross carries a bronze figure of Christ by Mowbrays of London. The stonework was by Samuel Hodgkinson of Borrowash.</p> <p>There is a presumption in favour of listing all war memorials.</p>

<p>A farmstead, built in the eighteenth century. The farmhouse is built of red brick in Flemish garden wall bond, with dentillated eaves beneath a gabled plain tile roof. It is two storeys tall. There is a central entrance door with segmental head, flanked by elongated window openings with similar heads. The adjoining threshing barn bears the partly illegible datestone that reads "WG 17 ...".</p> <p>Buildings that predate the reign of Queen Victoria are considered to have qualities of age that justify their inclusion on the Local List.</p>

Description
<p>A farmhouse, built before the accession of Queen Victoria. It is two and a half storeys tall, faced in smooth render beneath a gabled concrete tile roof. There is an offset entrance porch and bay window, flanked by tall window openings with rusticated wedge lintels.</p> <p>The farmhouse is considered to have special historic interest due to its close historic association with William Barron (1805-1891), a figure of national interest, who lived here from 1865. William Barron &amp; Son, landscape gardeners, formed in 1867. The tower to the rear of the building was probably added for the company in the late nineteenth century.</p> <p>An account of William Barron's life can be found in the Oxford Dictionary of National Biography.</p>

Description
<p>A Methodist Chapel, built in 1826. Converted to a Sunday School in 1900. It is built of red brick beneath a shallow pitched roof. The front elevation is of two storeys, separated by sill bands and topped by a pediment. There is a full height arched recess, containing a datestone in the form of a classical sarcophagus.</p> <p>Buildings that predate the reign of Queen Victoria are considered to have qualities of age that justify their inclusion on the Local List.</p>

Description
<p>A Methodist Chapel, built in 1851 and enlarged in 1871. Converted to a Sunday School in 1903. The chapel is faced in render beneath a gabled slate roof. The front elevation is single storey. There is a plain semi-circular headed doorway, flanked by very large vertical sash windows with rusticated wedge lintels. There is a datestone above the doorway.</p> <p>The classical style remained popular for non-conformist chapels until c.1860. Chapels built before this date are generally considered to have qualities of age that justify their inclusion on the Local List.</p>

Description
-------------

A house, probably built c.1865 for William Mallalieu (d.1871). It was later occupied by his son William Mallalieu JP (1860-1908). The house is built of red brick with bracketed eaves beneath a hipped slate roof. The south elevation is two storeys tall, composed of three wide bays. The centre bay features a pair of vertical sash windows with squared lintels; above, there are similar windows with semi-circular heads. The west elevation features a canted stone bay window.

The property is entered via a red brick gate lodge and timber gate.

This building may possess some special historic interest due to its close historic association with William Mallalieu JP, a figure of local interest.

<p>A shop built in 1820. It is built of red brick beneath a gabled slate roof. The side elevation is three storeys tall. The ground and first floors each contain a pair of vertical sashes with glazing bars beneath wedge lintels. The rear return contains a doorcase and a single similar window. The rear wing is one-and-a-half storeys tall.</p> <p>Buildings that predate the reign of Queen Victoria are considered to have qualities of age that justify their inclusion on the Local List.</p>

Description
<p>A house, built in 1762. Converted to a public house before 1821 and substantially extended to the rear in the late nineteenth century. The building is faced with roughcast render beneath a gabled plain tile roof. It is two-and-a-half storeys tall. There is an off-centre entrance door with a segmental head. To the left is a two-storey range built of painted brick; the upper room of this range served as the club room of the Ockbrook Friendly Society.</p> <p>Buildings that predate the reign of Queen Victoria are considered to have qualities of age that justify their inclusion on the Local List.</p>

<p>An early eighteenth century inn, incorporating a seventeenth century house. To the right, the house is built of painted brick beneath a gabled plain tile roof. To the left, the inn is faced in smooth render beneath a steeply pitched slate roof with gable parapets.</p> <p>Buildings that predate c.1700 (the "brick threshold") are considered to have qualities of age that strongly justify their inclusion on the Local List.</p>

Description
<p>Formerly known as the Hollies.  A Georgian house, extended in the mid to late nineteenth century and again in the early twentieth century.  The Georgian wing is faced in smooth render beneath a gabled concrete tile roof. It is three storeys tall. The first floor features three plain sash windows beneath rusticated wedge lintels.  From 1905 to 1928 this was the home of Samuel Bunning, chairman of the Beeston Brewery Company.</p> <p>Buildings that predate the reign of Queen Victoria are considered to have qualities of age that justify their inclusion on the Local List.</p>
