

The farmhouse is considered to have special historic interest due to its close historic association with William Barron (1805-1891), a figure of national interest, who lived here from 1865. William Barron & Son, landscape gardeners, formed in 1867. The tower to the rear of the building was probably added for the company in the late nineteenth century. An account of William Barron's life can be found in the Oxford Dictionary of National Biography.


