

Community Grant Schemes 2025-26

Supporting Information

Erewash Borough Council has allocated £65,000 towards community grants schemes for the financial year that runs from 1 April 2025 until 31 March 2026.

Aims of the funding

The council is working towards 'creating vibrant and sustainable communities' and within the <u>Corporate Strategy 2024-2028</u>, there are key strands of work that will help to do this. Each application must set out how the activity or project will support at least one of the priorities:

- Economy and Regeneration work to rejuvenate the economy.
- Supporting communities to be active, healthy and safe.
- Sustainable environment create an environment for the future.

Who can apply for funding?

The grant schemes are open to voluntary / community groups or organisations. Registered charities, social enterprises and Parish Councils* can also apply.

The organisation must meet the definition of a 'qualifying organisation'. For details, please see the Community Grants Policy 2025-2028.

*Parish Councils may seek funding for a project or activity that is not a statutory function.

Organisations can only receive one community grant per year.

What can the funding be used for?

Erewash Community Grants are only open to groups or organisations who are working in and supporting Erewash residents.

A Community Grant can pay for new or extended activities to meet demand in the community. Applications can be made to cover project costs including:

- Additional room hire, energy or admin costs
- Equipment, project materials, furniture or improvements to facilities
- Additional staffing costs to cover extended hours (including cleaning)

- Funding to train new volunteers or give existing volunteers new skills
- · Activities and refreshments
- Community events and engagement activities

Grant Schemes available

There are two community grant schemes available in 2025-2026. The table below shows the differences.

Conditions of funding

The Community Grants Policy 2025-2028 outlines general conditions of community grants.

In addition, the following conditions also apply:

- Only one Community Grant per organisation per year.
- Applications will need to include quotes for items or services between the following thresholds:

- For each item / service with a unit price of between £1,000 and £5,000, one quote must be attached.
- For each item / service with a unit price of over £5,000, two quotes must be attached.
- The Panel will not fund projects or activities that are already being funded through other sources (unless it is match funding).
- Where an application requires match funding (the grant doesn't cover the entirety of the costs), the application will need to provide detail on the match funding.
- The financial position of organisations will be taken into consideration as part of the decision-making process. The application will need to confirm current levels of reserves, and why any significant surpluses cannot be used to fund the activity.
- Organisations will need to work with the council to show their compliance with the Subsidy Control Act 2022. If a grant award is considered to be a Minimal Financial Assistance (MFA) subsidy, successful applicants will need to complete notification documents before the grant can be paid.
- The Panel decision is final with no appeals.
